Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow!

Last year the Winter Operations Division of Lincoln Transportation and Utilities (LTU) instituted a number of well-received changes. One of these changes was the use of private companies and individuals to plow the residential streets.

The City will continue this contracting practice, while having City employees maintain the emergency snow routes, arterial streets and bus routes. To track the progress of the plows, go to Lincoln.ne.gov/snowfighting.

Parking Bans

Three types of bans may be declared.

1. A Snow Emergency Parking Ban

Parking is banned on both sides of emergency snow routes, arterial streets and bus routes.

2. Snow Removal District Parking Bans

Parking is banned on both sides of the street in the following areas designated as snow removal districts: Downtown, University Place, Havelock, Bethany, College View, 11th & G Streets, 17th & Washington Streets, and 25th & Sumner Streets.

3. Residential Parking Bans

Parking is banned on one side of all residential streets not covered above. Whether the ban is on the even or the odd-numbered side of the street, corresponds to the year i.e. In 2021 residential bans were declared on the odd-numbered side; in 2022 residential bans will be declared on the even-numbered side of the streets.

NOTE: If, on New Year's Eve, a Residential Parking Ban is declared, the ban will apply to the side of the street corresponding to the year that is coming to an end. i.e. this year it would be the odd-numbered side of the street.



Other Snow Related Ordinances

Property owners are required to clear snow and ice from sidewalks by 9:00 AM the day following the end of the day of the storm. Adjoining wheelchair ramps and curb cuts must also be cleared.

Unshoveled walks may be reported to the UPLNK app on your mobile phone or to lincoln.ne.gov/Payments-Services/UPLNK.

Snow Related Tips

- By shoveling the snow 10 feet to the left of your driveway, the probability of a blocked driveway is greatly diminished.
- Shoveling around hydrants and in front of mailboxes assists in the continuation of essential services.

Snow Angels Program

LTU coordinates a Snow Angels program. Residents who are physically unable to remove snow from sidewalks and driveways are encouraged to click on snow.lincoln.ne.gov/snow-angels/ to identify volunteers in our area willing to assist. Those willing to serve as volunteers should register using the same link.
